

## **TERNA: RELAUNCH OF THE AUTHORISATION PROCESS FOR THE RESTRUCTURING OF THE ELECTRICITY GRID IN VAL D'ISARCO**

**260 km of overhead power lines and more than 1,200 pylons marked for demolition**

**The intervention will strengthen the supply of electricity to the railway line along the  
Brenner axis**

**Rome, 14 July 2026** – Following the Italian Ministry of the Environment and Energy Security's relaunch of the authorisation process for project to restructure the electricity grid in Val d'Isarco, Terna is publishing a notice listing the plots of land potentially affected. The project, which has been updated to incorporate the provisions of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Decree and the outcomes of dialogue with the Autonomous Province of Bolzano and with local bodies, will enable an increase in the security, reliability and efficiency of the local electricity grid.

The restructuring of the electricity grid in Val d'Isarco planned by the company led by Pasqualino Monti will strengthen supply to the railway line along the Brenner axis, thanks in part to the construction of 190 km of new lines, more than one third of which will be underground. Terna's new interventions will enable the demolition of 260 km of overhead power lines and more than 1,200 pylons, freeing up over 600 hectares of land in total with benefits for the environment and for local communities.

The work has required some of the most complex planning ever executed by Terna for a single project. The immensity of the areas affected, most of which are in high mountain locations, required specialist environmental studies which laid the groundwork for a project of major importance while fully respecting the land, with a view to the increasingly sustainable development of the electricity grid.

Citizens, particularly the owners of the plots of land affected by the project, can consult the planning documents at the offices of the Ministry of the Environment and Energy Security, of the Autonomous Province of Bolzano, and of the municipalities involved. The documentation will also be available online, through the link indicated in the notice published on the municipal notice boards and on the website of the Autonomous Province of Bolzano. Any observations can be submitted to the Ministry

of the Environment and Energy Security and to Terna (for information) within 30 days of publication of the notice.
